

CITY OF NICHOLSON
COUNCIL MEETING
FEBRUARY 6, 2012

The City of Nicholson council met for the monthly council meeting. Those in attendance were Mayor Ronnie Maxwell; council members Bobby Crawford, Howard Wilbanks, Faye Seagraves and Jan Webster; City Clerk Wendy Carter; City attorney Jody Campbell.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Ronnie Maxwell.

Motion to approve the minutes and the agenda was made by Bobby Crawford; seconded by Howard Wilbanks. All were in favor.

City Attorney- Mayor Maxwell recommended Jody Campbell at the work session as our new city attorney. The council had a chance to ask him questions before the meeting. Motion to hire Jody Campbell as Nicholson's city attorney was made by Faye Seagraves; seconded by Jan Webster. All were in favor.

Speed bumps- The council recommended that the request for speed bumps on Jim David and Black Thorne be sent to the Planning and Zoning Board to look into.

Yard of the Season- Council member Jan Webster would like to start a yard of the season in Nicholson. She would have someone judge the yards for every season throughout the year and a gift card would be given to the winner. She stated she would provide the gift card and handle everything herself. She asked the city attorney Jody Campbell if there would be any problems with her, as a council member, taking part in it. He stated there wouldn't be any problem but that the gift cards should probably be donated to the city as a donation and then given out since it would have the City of Nicholson name on it. She agreed to the donation.

Motion to accept the proposal of a "yard of the season" was made by Jan Webster; seconded by Faye Seagraves. All were in favor.

Design for the water tank- Two different designs were presented to the council for the new water tank. One was a flag and the other was daisies. Motion to accept the daisies to be painted on the water tank was made by Faye Seagraves; seconded by Jan Webster. All were in favor.
